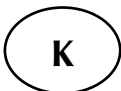
PICK UP BAGS ON ROSH HASHANAH

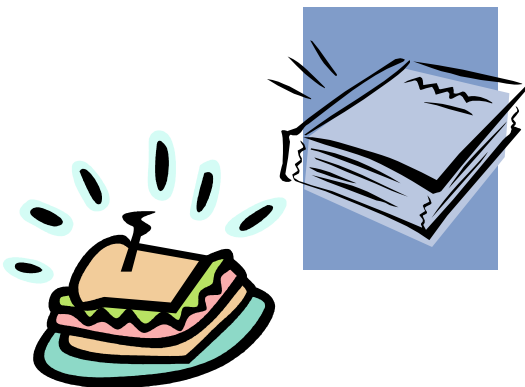


WANTED: VOLUNTEERS TO DISTRIBUTE BAGS AFTER ROSH HASHANAH SERVICES:

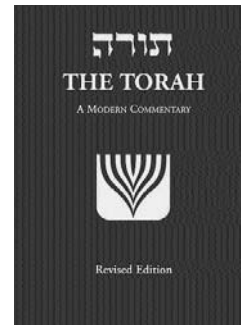


MISHKAN TEFILAH: A NEW REFORM SIDDUR
