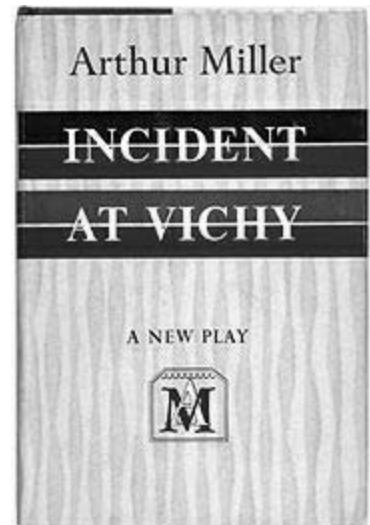
DISCUSSION OF PLAY

Congregant Ruth Adler will look at "Incident at Vichy," the compelling one-act play by dramatist Arthur Miller focusing on the subjects of human nature, guilt, fear and complicity set during World War II. The play premiered in New York City in 1964. The script was later revised for a film version.

"Incident at Vichy" revolves around a group of primarily Jewish detainees awaiting inspection by German officers in Vichy, France in 1942. Most of the characters are in a state of denial about the reason behind their arrests and the fate that awaits them. The play portrays the characters' persistent state of confusion and their struggles to accept why they are there while posing the haunting question of how the Nazis were able to perpetrate the Holocaust with so little resistance from their victims.

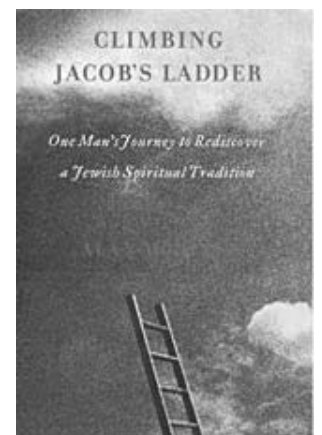

Diversity” with Clarence Page**

**Saturday, May 2 • 8:00 p.m.**

This year's keynote speaker, Pulitzer Prize winning columnist Clarence Page, will moderate a discussion on interpersonal relationships and the role of race in religious life: how we address race issues in our religious communities.

Mr. Page has been a columnist and member of the Chicago Tribune's editorial board since July 1984 and writes a syndicated column providing incisive and insightful commentary on American society and politics. He is an occasional guest panelist on the *McLaughlin Group*, a regular contributor of essays to *News Hour with Jim Lehrer* and an occasional host of documentaries on PBS.



This year's program features a renowned group of panelists including Archbishop Francis Cardinal George, Imam Abdul Malik Mujahid, chair of Sound Vision Foundation, a leading producer of educational content on Islam and Muslims, Alice Hunt, president of the Chicago Theological Seminary, and David Sandmel, Crown Ryan Professor of Jewish Studies at the Catholic Theological Union and an expert on Christian-Jewish relations.

The mission of the Golder Interfaith Lecture Series is to promote understanding among every faith and embrace the unifying spirituality of all religions. The lecture is free and open to the public.
